Bronx H.S. of Science needs regime change

To The Editor:

I read with interest the article about Bryan Sans' resignation from Bronx Science because of the parallels with my own experience with principal Valerie Reidy. Her suggestions that Mr. Sans "had personal issues or probably a better job" flies in the face of the wording of his letter which states "...I thought Bronx Science was a place I could teach for fifty years." It is VERY clear from his letter that Ms. Reidy was the sole reason for his departure, as she was mine. Any job without her would be "better" be definition!

One needs to ask Ms. Reidy whether the recent departure of her longtime "right hand," Operations Assistant Principal Linda Weissman, was also for personal reasons, as well as those of her last two Pupil Services (guidance) APs, Alan Borer and Diana Ferrer, each of which lasted only a year. What about the several seasoned teachers who relocated to Scarsdale? And then there is the jack-booted Ms. Chang, current guidance coordinator, who is a

Reidy clone, and who will probably be picked as the next AP/PS.
